On November 20th, Bluegrass Debate Coalition students attended the Wilson Wyatt Debate League November Tournament, an online debate competition. Students discussed the topic "Resolved: Increased United States federal regulation of cryptocurrency transactions and/or assets will produce more benefits than harms."

BDC students participated in the "Novice Public Forum" division, and received multiple awards. Aaron George and Aarav Tibrewal were the 2nd ranked debate team, and Aarko Guha, Aaron George, Aryan Rana, and Aarav Tibrewal all received speaker awards. Aarav Tibrewal received an award for being 2nd Top Speaker.

Throughout November, students competed in the BDC Fall Classic, a month-long debate tournament. As part of the After School Learning Program, the Bluegrass Debate Coalition created an innovative and accessible method of competition, allowing students to sign up for debates over the course of the week and after school. The BDC Fall Classic was a free and virtual event.

Students debated the topic, "Increased United States federal regulation of cryptocurrency transactions and/or assets will produce more benefits than harms."

Many Bluegrass Debate Coalition middle school and high school students exemplified leadership by volunteering to mentor students during weekly workshops and adjudicate debates as part of the BDC Fall Classic.


