BDC AFTER SCHOOL LEARNING DEBATE CLASSES CONCLUDED FOR 2022 SPRING SEMESTER

The Bluegrass Debate Coalition (BDC) offers a low-cost after school debate program to all elementary, middle and high school students in Kentucky.

The course helps students develop greater self-confidence, increase their critical thinking/reasoning skills, and learn to collaborate effectively.

Throughout 2021-2022, the BDC has hosted hundreds of classes for our students. BDC courses are an 8 week program, broken down into six weeks of class learning, two weeks of workshops, and a one-day capstone event.

The BDC has officially concluded our spring semester online ASL classes, with over 100 students participating in the program. Students from approximately 25 schools across the Commonwealth enrolled in the BDC after school learning debate classes. A breakdown by the numbers:

- ➤ 27 Elementary Students
- ➤ 72 Middle School Students
- ➤ 6 High School Students



March also concluded the pilot program with Ashland Elementary, for in-person ASL debate classes (featured image above).

Ashland Elementary scored an overall 3rd place of all schools at the Regional Championship, and two of their participants placed 3rd in the team event.

THE WEEKLY WORKSHOP

As part of our class structure, the BDC hosts several weekly workshop events where students are invited to practice and refine their debate skills through discussions with the opportunity to ask questions.

The workshops focus on giving students real debate experience through a method known as the "crossfire debate". Crossfire debates allow students to directly debate against their peers.



Currently, the BDC offers four weeks of workshop events, leading up to our final event for this season in May, the Youth Leadership Conference.
